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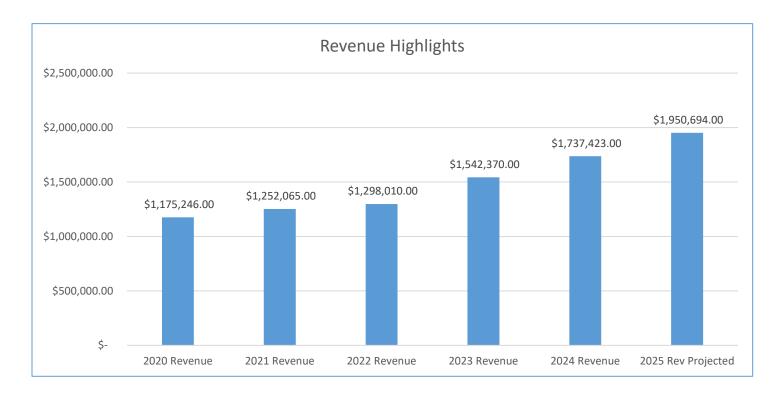

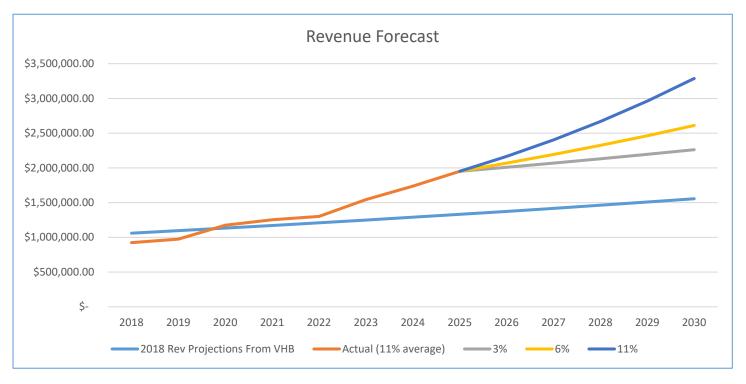

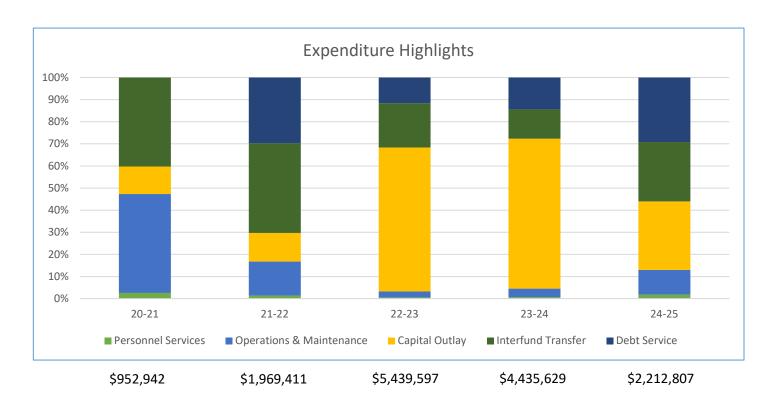

## OTHER NOTABLE FY24 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- Attended the annual Florida Redevelopment Conference to learn best practices and updates from redevelopment districts across the state.
- Made significant progress towards undergrounding utilities by placing conduit, installing decorative lights, and contracting with individual utility providers to pull wire and place critical infrastructure.
- Finalized the Multimodal Overpass design with FDOT.
- Completed the Multi-Use Pathway Phase II Design with McKim and Creed.
- Completed the Daniel Circle Streetscape construction with Roads Inc.
- Completed CRA Annual Paving Program.
- Supported the CRA Police Initiative, funding a dedicated officer and enhanced enforcement such as school intersection safety during peak hours and community policing.
- Administered the Façade Improvement Grant Program to support maintaining a quality image and consistent character in the CRA.
- Finalized the design for the repair and improvement of Wayside Park East and West.
- Construction on Wayside Park East began, including replacing the boardwalk and Pier.
- Completed design on the Wayside Park West Sunset Promenade.
- Completed removing and replacing the shade structures in Wayside Park East.
- Progressed the ADA transition plan by replacing the deficient sidewalk on Ladner Lane and Center Road.
- Partnered with Escambia County to complete the repair and improvement of Vista Park.
- Supported the City's Safe Streets program by funding pedestrian lights throughout the CRA.
- Funded critical infrastructure such as traffic lights, generators, irrigation wells, and lift stations within the CRA to support storm hardening and safety.
- Funded the Natural Resource Division for landscape maintenance within the CRA.
- Completed a vacant property redevelopment project for the construction of First Watch and Chipotle.

#### **FY2025 GOALS**

- Complete a major CRA objective of undergrounding utilities in Sec A&B.
- Begin Work on Undergrounding Section C.
- Enhance beautification and roadway safety by supporting in-house maintenance teams within the Natural Resource Division of Public Works.
- Enhance safety by supporting and expanding the Safe Street Lighting Program.
- Improve resiliency and storm preparedness by funding enhanced critical utility infrastructure such as emergency generators.
- Attend the Florida Redevelopment Association conference for redevelopment training.
- Expand the Façade Improvement Program to new applicants.
- Begin the large-scale redevelopment grant program.
- Support the CRA policing initiative to enhance safety and improve trust and communication between the community and law enforcement.
- Repair broken sidewalks to improve safety and ADA mobility.
- Continue to repair and enhance Wayside Park by redeveloping the boat ramp and building the Sunset Promenade.
- Improve State Road 399 by providing landscape and streetscape elements.
